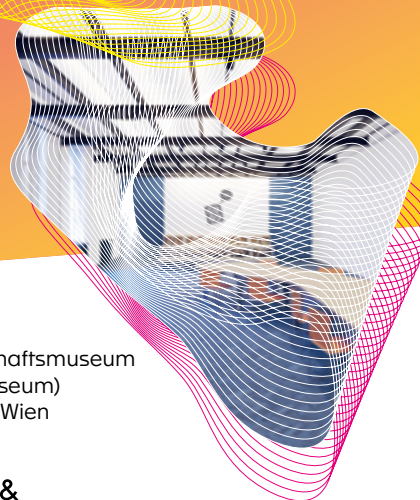

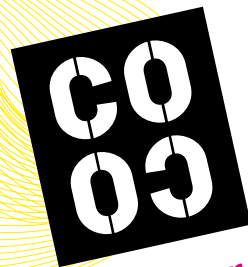
Where does money come from?
